Course Description

Concussion, also known as mild traumatic brain injury (mTBI), is a very common condition in the United States. accounting for 80% of all traumatic brain injuries, with as many as 3.8 million injuries occurring yearly from sport-related events alone. Although the vast majority of individuals with a single concussion recover within days to weeks, a significant minority develops longterm problems, which collectively are known as postconcussion syndrome. This one-day course will address identification of people with concussions, epidemiology and clinical outcomes, emerging neuroimaging technologies to study and better understand concussion rehabilitation and other medical means of treating concussion, pitfalls of existing neurocognitive batteries regarding return to play, guidelines for return to play, and special education accommodations required for injured students.

Target Audience

This course is for health professionals involved in assessing and managing athletes with sports concussions including emergency medicine physicians, neurologists, neurosurgeons, pediatricians, physiatrists, primary care physicians, psychiatrists, sports medicine physicians, athletic trainers, neuropsychologists, nurses, physician assistants, physical therapists, psychologists, and occupational therapists.
